

Headteacher Newsletter November 2022

Dear pupils and parents,

I thought that it might be very useful to bring you all up to speed on events that have been happening at school recently. The children have settled back to school so well after half term.

Parents Evenings

Thank you to all our parents for being so flexible with the parents evening arrangements. I hope that everybody has been able to meet with their child/children's class teacher and that you feel that you have been updated with individual progress. Can I remind you that whilst it is lovely to conduct the sessions face to face – we can also offer remote sessions for parents who are away from home or required to work at the times offered and that our doors remain firmly open. As always, outside of the cycle of parents evening, if you do have any concerns about your child or their learning, please do let us know and we will find a mutually convenient time to talk about your concerns and hopefully be able to offer support.

Supporting your child with their learning

The way that the children are taught at school may be very different from the way that you learnt. However, parental support for home learning remains a very important part of the school-home partnership. We are often asked by our parents 'How can we help?' Whilst there is no single answer, there are some answers that may be useful:

- Reading is key all children need to read regularly at home and fluent reading is rarely achieved without
 consistent parental support. Even fluent readers benefit from a light-touch approach to parental support.
 For younger readers making the reading session short, sharp and fun is hugely beneficial and if your
 child is struggling to read or resisting reading at home please do contact the class teacher who may be
 able to offer some suggestions to make it easier. Home reading should not be a battle!
- Accelerated Reader we have purchased Accelerated Reader which is a sophisticated programme to support reading. Children in Years 3 - 6 will use the Accelerated Reading programme to help manage their reading once they have completed their Early Reading programmes. This is being rolled out Class by Class and your Class Teacher will provide further information via Dojo in the coming weeks
- Maths spending time to support the acquisition of the 'four rules of arithmetic' is never wasted time. The more confident children are with their mental maths (including times tables) the better and the Government expects all children to have rapid recall of all times tables by the end of year 4. After year 4, we still need to work to maintain the rapid recall! There are many free apps that can be used to support times tables learning. The White Rose Maths Minute Maths App is free and for older children Hit the Button is a great way to learn and targets times tables, Early maths and KS1. You can equally do maths without technology through repetition or games.

School Attendance

Good attendance at school is critical to success in learning. This includes being on time for lessons in the morning as children who are 'rushed into school' or habitually the last to arrive can find this very unsettling. Please do try to be on time although we do understand, there are always 'those mornings' when things do go wrong. Your child will not be told off for being late so please do reassure them of this if needed. If you are struggling with arriving on time, please contact the school as support may be available.

The rules regarding term-time holidays have not changed and only in exceptional circumstances are these allowed. There is a form to complete if you need to request time off during term time and this is available from the office or on our website. Please note, 14 days' notice is required. If you are unsure about the rules, please contact the school office.

Good to be Green and Great to be Gold

We have also recently launched across all three classrooms the 'Good to be Green and Great to be Gold' scheme to support behaviour management. All children start every day on a green card. If a child remains on green all week, they will receive a Dojo point for 'Good to be Green'. If the child then remains on Green for the whole term, they will receive a 'Great to be Gold' card in a whole school assembly. If the child then goes on to remain on 'Green' for the remaining terms, they will be awarded a certificate. This behaviour system ensures that the children who are persistently demonstrating positive behaviour are recognised and celebrated.

More information about the scheme can be found in the School Behaviour Policy, which will be updated at our Full Governing Board (16/11/22) and then shared with parents.

School Uniform 2022-2023

This is a polite reminder that we expect children to be dressed in full school uniform. Many of the girls choose to wear leggings instead of tights with their skirts and shorts – which seems sensible and helps to protect knees.

The PE Uniform is:

- Tracksuit, jogging trousers or legging in black or blue
- A fleece in blue or black or a round necked school sweatshirt
- Round neck t-shirt in white or blue (we would prefer a school logo on the t-shirt but it is not a requirement)
- Navy or black short (advised for Spring / Summer)
- Trainers or plimsolls in a dark colour

NSPCC

This term, we will be participating in the **NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe.** online programme. This consists of an online assembly and supporting classroom based activities. *Speak out. Stay safe.* is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or Childline.
