If your child is already in After School Provision and they would like to join a club on that day then please let Beccy know and they will join the club and then rejoin After School Provision if they are staying until 6pm. There is no additional charge. If they don't join a club but are staying for afterschool, it will be child-led play.

School Improvements

Now that the weather has started to improve (slightly) we have been having a big tidy up of the outdoor spaces. PTA have very kindly offered to help organise a team of willing helpers to complete some jobs in the outside spaces like jet washing and pruning. We would be very grateful for any help anyone can offer! Please keep an eye out for details of possible dates. We are very keen to revamp the pond area, re-establish the raised beds and composting.

We are pleased to let you know that the funds from the PTA have enabled us to purchase a role play wooden corner shop for Early Years and Key Stage 1 children. This is being erected during the Easter holidays so will hopefully be ready for them to enjoy in the new term. A massive thank you to the PTA and all parents for being so actively supportive in fundraising for the school.

We have also been able to purchase some new books for the libraries in Class 2 and 3 that the children were involved in choosing. Some of the books have deliberately been chosen as they are recommended for primary schools and include subject areas which cover protected characteristics. This is an important area of our curriculum which is delivered through PSHE sessions and assemblies. Protected Characteristics education in primary schools centres around the education of pupils that everyone has the right not to be treated less favourably, or subjected to an unfair disadvantage, by reason of that characteristic, for example, because of your age, race, religion, sex or sexual orientation. In law, there are 9 protected characteristics under the Equality Act 2010 which are:

- Age
- Disability
- Gender reassignment
- Race
- Religion or belief

- Sex
- Sexual orientation
- Marriage and civil partnership
- Pregnancy and maternity

As always, the staff are responsible for ensuring that this is delivered in a caring environment and in a vage and stage appropriate.

Science Curriculum

The team have been reviewing our science curriculum as part of our ongoing cycle of curriculum review. With the departure of Mr Petts (previously the science lead), Miss Moore has kindly agreed to take over the subject leadership of this core subject. Initially, she will work with Mrs Gemmell and the team and assume full curriculum leadership from September 2023.

We have been undertaking CPD with staff for science teaching and learning and our renewed curriculum will come into effect from September 2023. Until then, we are ensuring that key areas of learning that were missed in lock-down have been covered. We have been very fortunate to attend several training sessions which have been led by Jane Banham as part of the Valley Enthuse Bursary project. Having access to specialists in the subject to help us develop our curriculum and the teachers subject knowledge is hugely helpful and has been funded by the STEM bursary that we have. We are focusing on our Working Scientifically skills to ensure that we have good progression in skills and knowledge for our children. We are hoping to seek further parent input in the summer term through reinstating visits from parents who work in STEM related areas.
